

2019 Queensland Group Review Education Competitions**1.0 INTENTION**

- 1.1 The Queensland Group's Annual Review will be conducted 5th & 6th October 2019 including Field, Education & Athletics (ball games, running races, swimming) Competitions.
- 1.2 Competitions will be conducted at the Sunshine Coast Recreation Centre, 80 Currimundi Road Currimundi Qld 4551. Accommodation and meals will be on site.
- 1.3 The intent of this circular is to give squadrons details of the Education competitions being run in conjunction with this years Review.
- 1.4 Details on Field Competitions, Accommodation, Meals, Dress and other administrative arrangements for the Review can be found in Group Field Circular QL/FC/03/19 – *2019 Queensland Group Review*.

2.0 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 2.1 Education competitions intended to be offered in the 2019 Queensland Group Review are as follows (please note unforeseen circumstances may alter this list at any time).

See attached criteria on each competition.

- 2.1.1 Outstanding Cadet Education Award.
- 2.1.2 Squadron Education Points Trophy.
- 2.1.3 Overall Review Education Trophy.
- 2.1.4 Squadron Education Display with the theme; "Drones in Modern Aviation".
- 2.1.5 Individual Essay with the theme; "Drones in Modern Aviation".
- 2.1.6 Individual Diorama with the theme; "Drones in Modern Aviation".
- 2.1.6 Balsa Chuck Glider.
- 2.1.7 Plastic Kit Model.
- 2.1.8 Kite.
- 2.1.9 Built Up Non-Flying Balsa Model.
- 2.1.10 Open Modelling.
- 2.1.11 Photography Competition (Individual themes).
- 2.2 Where age groups are specified, the person's age as of September 7th 2019 will apply.

2.3 Nominations for all competitions must be in the Group Events Database **no later than September 7th, 2019.**

2.4 NO LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

2.5 **NO** model, chuck glider or kite entries will be accepted after September 7th 2019. As such unregistered entries after this time **WILL NOT** be accepted at competition check-in at the Review.

3.0 OUTSTANDING CADET EDUCATION AWARD

3.1 The Cadet with the most outstanding results in Education since the last Qld Group Review will be the winner. Nominees **must be present** at the Group Review and only Members of the Australian Air League under 18 years old are eligible.

3.2 Squadron Officers Commanding are to submit their Squadron's nomination in writing with the following details for the above Award. Email nomination to the Group Education Commissioner by September 7th 2019.

3.2.1 NOMINEE'S: Name, Age, Rank, Membership Number, Squadron.

3.2.2 A.A.L. Education achievements, accomplishments and activities awarded and/or participated in between 7th May 2018 and 7th September 2019.

3.2.3 Include whether cadet was also instructing classes and detail any other information that will help the cadet to win this award. Education information relating to events outside of the League may be provided but will have minimal weighting on the competition.

3.3 Nominations are to be received by the Group Education Commissioner no later than September 7th 2019. NO LATE NOMINATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

3.4 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction is made between age or gender. The most outstanding entry wins.

4.0 SQUADRON EDUCATION POINTS TROPHY

4.1 Awarded to the squadron, which has attained the highest number of *total* trophy points between 7th May 2018 and 7th September 2019.

4.2 There is no entry form required for this competition as the G.E.C. will already have all the relevant details to calculate the winning squadron.

5.0 OVERALL REVIEW EDUCATION TROPHY

5.1 Awarded to the squadron to gain the most education points at the Group Review.

5.2 There is no entry form required for this competition as the G.E.C. will already have all the relevant details to calculate the winning squadron.

6.0 SQUADRON EDUCATION DISPLAY

- 6.1 The theme for the 2019 Education Display is: "Drones in Modern Aviation".
- 6.2 All entries in the Education Display must comply with the following provisions:
- 6.2.1 All entries are to be planned around a maximum table size of TWO metres by ONE metre. Tables will be provided for Displays.
 - 6.2.2 Squadrons wishing to display larger items or special items of equipment are to advise the Group Education Commissioner who will note it on the entry form.
 - 6.2.3 Electricity is available in the display area but extension cords must be provided by the Squadron, including tape to secure leads to the floor if necessary. NOTE; ALL 240 VOLT WIRING MUST BE CARRIED OUT BY SUITABLY QUALIFIED PERSONS.
 - 6.2.4 Displays must be erected and dismantled by Squadron personnel.
 - 6.2.5 All displays must be erected for judging by 1000 hours on Saturday 5th October 2019.
 - 6.2.6 Displays will remain assembled until after Final Presentation on Saturday 5th October 2019.
 - 6.2.7 All persons participating in the Education Display Competition, in any capacity, must be financial members of the Australian Air League.
- 6.3 All care will be taken but Squadrons are responsible for the security of their displays.
- 6.4 Entry must be submitted to the Qld Group Events Database no later than 7th September 2019.**
- 6.5 Judging of Squadron Education Displays will commence at 1100 hours on 5th October 2019. All members except for selected personnel will vacate the display area whilst judging is being carried out.
- 6.6 Squadron Education Displays will be judged on the following criteria with points allocated as indicated.
- 6.6.1 **Layout:** (10 points). A well-structured and uncluttered display is expected.
 - 6.6.2 **Visual Impact** (10 points). Legibility at a viewing distance of 1.5 metres is essential and the initial impact must be pleasing
 - 6.6.3 **Use of Materials:** (10 points). Creativity in the use of materials is sought. No preference will be given to hand sketches versus photographs or magazine pictures.
 - 6.6.4 **Skill:** (10 points). More points will be awarded to the use of a wide range of skills versus a narrow set of skills.
 - 6.6.5 **Cadet Participation:** (20 points). Names and ages of members must appear on all parts of the Display indicating who did that particular part of the work. This may be at a drawing sheet, operating component or written section level. Where a number of cadets completed one section, their combined names should appear. The greater the percentage of members of a squadron participating, the higher the mark based upon Squadron strength as at 7th September 2019. Each Squadron is to supply the Squadron strength to the Group Education

- 6.6.6 **Content:** (20 points). Preference will be shown to displays, which more extensively cover the theme compared to those, which cover only one small part of the overall theme.
- 6.6.7 **Standard of Overall Finish:** (10 points). The quality of workmanship will be assessed, taking into account the age of the members used in the preparation of the Display.
- 6.6.8 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry or cadet participation level not indicated.

7.0 INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION ESSAY.

- 7.1 The theme for the 2019 Education Essay Competition is: "Drones in Modern Aviation".
- 7.2 All entries in the Education Essay Competition must comply with the following provisions:
 - 7.2.1 All entrants must be financial members of the Australian Air League under 18 years.
 - 7.2.2 Each member can submit only one entry. Additional essays may be written for display but will not be judged. In this case, the competitor will clearly label which essay is to be judged.
 - 7.2.3 All handwritten entries must be neat, clear and well defined.
 - 7.2.4 Each entry must be clearly marked with the following participant information:
 - 7.2.4.1 Name;
 - 7.2.4.2 Age (on 7th September 2019);
 - 7.2.4.3 Certificate number and;
 - 7.2.4.4 Unit name (Squadron).
- 7.3 Entries for Groups **Two** and **Three** are to be submitted on white A4 size paper.
- 7.4 Group One: 8-11 years of age. A simple project (presented as a **scrapbook**).
- 7.5 Group Two: 12-14 years of age. An essay of between 1000 and 1500 words.
- 7.6 Group Three: 15-17 years of age. An essay of between 1500 and 2500 words.
- 7.7 All essays remain the intellectual property of the Australian Air League and return of any essays following the Group Review cannot be guaranteed.
- 7.8 Judging criteria for the Education Essay Competition will be as follows.
 - 7.8.1 **Presentation:** (20 Points) The overall appearance of the information presented will be judged. The layout should be clear and well presented. Where pictures have been attached to the page, the alignment with other elements and neatness will be considered. Neat handwriting will be considered as equivalent to typed/printed information.
 - 7.8.2 **Content:** (20 Points) Preference will be given to those presentations and essays that more extensively cover the theme compared to those which choose to cover a narrow part of the theme.

- 7.8.3 **Accuracy of information:** (10 Points) Information presented will be checked for accuracy. Misleading, outdated or incorrect information shall be marked down. Presentations and essays that present more detailed information relevant to the topic will be preferred.
- 7.8.4 **Interest level for the reader:** (20 Points) This judging criterion shall be based on how well the attention of the reader is captured by the manner in which the information is presented.
- 7.8.5 **Structure:** (10 Points) The presentation or essay will be judged on the way the information flows from the introduction to the conclusion. Information that is grouped appropriately will be preferred over information that is presented in a haphazard fashion.
- 7.8.6 **Application:** (10 Points) Preference will be given to those presentations and essays that do not just contain words that have been copied from other sources. Efforts made by the member to expand on the theme in their own words will be recognised. It is permissible to use internet for research, but obvious 'internet downloads' without substantial member input will not be judged favourably. N.B. Essays should include a level of referencing appropriate to the participant's age. All entries **must** contain a Bibliography and/or Reference List.
- 7.8.7 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.
- 7.9 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner in each age group.
- 7.10 **All essays are to be received with accompanying entry details by the Group Education Commissioner no later than midnight on the 7th October 2019.**

NO LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

8.0 INDIVIDUAL DIORAMA

- 8.1 Additional Conditions of Entry for Dioramas.
- 8.2 Each diorama shall contain at least one aircraft model.
- 8.3 The maximum size of the base of the diorama shall not exceed 50cm x 50cm.
- 8.4 Scale: All elements in the diorama should be in approximately the same scale.
- 8.5 Judging criteria for the Diorama Competition will be as follows;
- 8.5.1 **Layout:** (15 Points) A well-structured and uncluttered diorama is expected compared to one that is unstructured and cluttered.
- 8.5.2 **Use of Materials:** (15 Points) Creativity in the use of materials is sought.
- 8.5.3 **Skill:** More points shall be given to the use of a wider range of skills compared to a narrow set of skills.

- 8.5.4 **Construction:** (15 Points) Construction faults will be noted. The different parts of the models used in the diorama shall be glued to ensure all joints fit tightly together. Gaps between joints and tool marks are to be avoided. Similarly, excessive use of glue and smearing of glue is also to be avoided.
- 8.5.5 **Finish:** (15 Points) Attention shall be given to how the materials used on the diorama have been applied. The following shall be taken into account; the proper application of decals or decorations, brush marks and paint runs, unrealistic weathering and contamination.
- 8.5.6 **Presentation:** (15 Points) The overall presentation is judged on the first impression from approximately arms distance. This takes into account the way the elements in the diorama are positioned, the realism of their presentation and the general appearance as would be seen by a casual observer.
- 8.5.7 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.

9.0 INDIVIDUAL Balsa Chuck Glider.

- 9.1 Chuck Glider Competition is intended to be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 9.2 Nominated chuck gliders are to be registered with Group Education Commissioner by 1000 hours on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 9.3 The Competition will be held in three sections.
 - 9.3.1 Group One: Ages 8 – 11 Years.
 - 9.3.2 Group Two: Ages 12 – 14 Years.
 - 9.3.3 Group Three: Ages 15 – 17 Years.
- 9.4 All entries in the Balsa Chuck Glider Competition must comply with the following provisions:
 - 9.4.1 UNLIMITED entries per squadron.
 - 9.4.2 Only one entry per person.
 - 9.4.3 MODEL MUST BE CONSTRUCTED BY THE PERSON FLYING IT.
 - 9.4.4 Maximum wingspan is not to exceed 500mm. (Measured wingtip to wingtip).
 - 9.4.5 All entrants must be financial members of the Australian Air League.
 - 9.4.6 Gliders will be judged on the following criteria;
 - 9.4.6.1 **Outline:** (10 Points) The outline shall be sharp and smooth. For example, straight edges to be cut straight. Avoid scallops or missing chunks. Curves to be smooth, avoiding missing chunks. Both halves of the wing shall be isometric. For example, if the wing was cut through the chord at the centre of the span and folded one side over the other, sides should be the same shape. The outlines of parts are not to be undercut. In order to avoid undercut, the knife of the blade shall be held so that the

9.4.6.2 **Finish:** (10 Points) The whole model shall be sanded to a smooth finish using very fine sandpaper. Chuck gliders are not usually decorated. However, it is recommended that the model be given two coats of thin dope or banana oil to seal from moisture and this also assists to obtain a smooth finish. No additional points are given for decoration.

9.4.6.3 **Construction:** (10 Points) The different parts of the model shall be glued to ensure all joints fit tightly together. Gaps between joints are to be avoided. Similarly, excessive use of glue and smearing of glue is also to be avoided.

9.4.6.4 **Alignment:** (10 Points) It is important to ensure the chord of the wing and tailplane are parallel to the centre line of the fuselage. Also, the fin shall be mounted vertical to the fuselage. The wings shall be mounted so that if a line was drawn horizontal to the fuselage under them, the distance measured from this line to the leading edge of the wing at any given point is the same on both sides of the fuselage.

9.4.6.5 **Duration of Flight:** (50 Points) Participants will show their model's ability to fly by throwing their glider against a stopwatch two times. The longest of the two times will be recorded.

9.4.6.6 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.

9.4.7 The Penalty for oversized Gliders will be 20% of the Flying Duration Time.

9.5 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner in each age group.

10.0 INDIVIDUAL PLASTIC KIT MODEL.

10.1 The Plastic Kit Model Competition will be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.

10.2 All members are invited to submit entries for the Plastic Kit Model Competition.

10.3 **All models must be accompanied by the plans from which they were constructed and the box the model came in.**

10.4 The Competition will be held in three sections.

10.4.1 Group One: Ages 8 – 11 Years.

10.4.2 Group Two: Ages 12 – 14 Years.

10.4.3 Group Three: Ages 15 – 17 Years.

10.5 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner in each age group.

10.6 All entries in the Plastic Kit Model Competition must comply with the following provisions:

- 10.6.1 Model Scale is OPEN.
- 10.6.2 Model to be **fully** detailed and painted.
- 10.6.3 Model to be constructed by the person entering it.
- 10.6.4 Only one entry per person.
- 10.6.5 All entrants to be financial members of the Australian Air League.
- 10.6.6 All models to be registered with the Group Education Commissioner or their Staff on the day of judging. Only model entries nominated on the Group Events Database by 7th September 2019 will be registered.
- 10.7 Plastic Kit Models are judged on the following criteria with points allocated as indicated;
 - 10.7.1 **Overall Appearance:** (15 Points) The overall appearance is judged on the first impression from approximately one arms distance. This takes into account the way the model is presented and the general appearance as would be seen by a casual observer.
 - 10.7.2 **Paintwork:** (15 Points) The paintwork is judged on how the member has painted the model. It takes into account the use of brush or airbrush. For brush: whether there are brush marks, cleanness of line, thickness of paint and to a limited extent authenticity. For airbrush: whether there is over spray, cleanness of lines, thickness of paint and again to a limited extent authenticity. Overall: whether details have been painted e.g. cockpit, undercarriage, ordinances, engine etc.
 - 10.7.3 **Attention to Detail:** (15 Points) This judging criterion shall be based on how the member has assembled the model and whether the member has detailed the model beyond just putting the kit together. Attention shall be given as to how the member has assembled all the small parts that are sometimes missed.
 - 10.7.4 **Decals:** (15 Points) This judging criterion shall be based on how the decals are applied to the model, including correct alignment and an example of this is the direction that the kangaroo faces on Australian military aircraft. A model without decals would in most cases lose marks.
 - 10.7.5 **Overall Finish:** (15 Points) This judging criterion takes into account the overall finish of the model. This shall include how the joins are finished. It also takes into account how the model looks at closer inspection. This should be achieved without the need to pick up the model in order to inspect it thoroughly.
 - 10.7.6 **Glasswork:** (15 Points) Glasswork shall take into account the way windows; canopies, lights etc are attached to the model. It shall also take into account how the glasswork is detailed.
 - 10.7.7 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.
- 10.8 All models must be available for judging by 1000 hours on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 10.9 All persons except for selected personnel will vacate the display area whilst judging is being carried out.

- 10.10 All care will be taken however no responsibility will be accepted by the League to safeguard models from the public.
- 10.11 Any person wishing to construct more than one model may do so and duplicate models will be displayed but will not be judged.

11.0 INDIVIDUAL KITE.

- 11.1 Kite Competition is intended to be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 11.2 Nominated kites are to be registered with Group Education Commissioner by 1000 hours on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 11.3 Entries will be limited to one per person.
- 11.4 The Competition will be held in three sections.
 - 11.4.1 Group One: Ages 8 – 11 Years
 - 11.4.2 Group Two: Ages 12 – 14 Years
 - 11.4.3 Group Three: Ages 15 – 17 Years
- 11.5 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner in each age group.
- 11.6 All entries in the Kite Competition must comply with the following provisions:
 - 11.6.1 The Kite must be designed and constructed by the person flying it.
 - 11.6.2 No limit on size, but only one person to fly the kite.
 - 11.6.3 May use a second person to help launch the kite
 - 11.6.4 All entrants must be financial members of the Australian Air League.
- 11.7 Kites will be judged on the following criteria with points allocated as indicated.
 - 11.7.1 **Design/Appearance:** (15 Points) Points will be given for originality in use of materials, form and colour.
 - 11.7.3 **Construction:** (15 Points) The different parts of the kite shall be glued/assembled to ensure all joints fit tightly together. Gaps between points are to be avoided. Similarly, excessive use of glue and smearing of glue is also to be avoided.
 - 11.7.4 **Finish:** (10 Points) Attention shall be given to the covering materials used on the model and how they have been applied. The following shall be taken into account; creases in the covering, sealing of edges, if used the proper application of decals or decorations.
 - 11.7.5 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.

- 11.7.6 **Duration of Flight:** (50 Points) Participants will show their kites ability to fly by throwing their kite against a stopwatch two times. The longest of the two times will be recorded.

12.0 INDIVIDUAL BUILT-UP NON-FLYING Balsa MODEL.

- 12.1 The Built-Up Balsa Model Competition will be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 12.2 Entries will be limited to one per person.
- 12.3 This competition is a NON-FLYING Competition. e.g. (Control-Line, Radio Control, Free Flight and Static Models).
- 12.4 The Competition will be held in three sections.
- 12.4.1 Group One: Ages 8 – 11 Years
- 12.4.2 Group Two: Ages 12 – 14 Years
- 12.4.3 Group Three: Ages 15 – 17 Years
- 12.5 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner in each age group.
- 12.6 All entries in the Built-Up Balsa Model Competition must comply with the following provisions:
- 12.6.1 Model Scale is open,
- 12.6.2 Model to be fully detailed and painted,
- 12.6.3 Model to be constructed by the person entering it,
- 12.6.4 All models are to be of aircraft,
- 12.6.5 All entrants to be financial members of the League,
- 12.6.6 All models to be registered with the G.E.C. or their assistant on the day of judging,
- 12.6.7 All models must be available for judging from 1000 hours on 5th October 2019,
- 12.6.8 All members except for judging personnel will vacate the display area while judging is being carried out,
- 12.6.9 All models are to be drained of fuel and have the glow plug removed,
- 12.6.10 All models are to be accompanied by instructions sheets.
- 12.7 All care and no responsibility will be accepted to safeguard models from the public
- 12.8 Built-Up Balsa Model will be judged on the following criteria with points allocated as indicated.

- 12.8.1 **Assembly:** (20 Points) All base components, i.e. wing, tailplane, etc shall be attached and correctly aligned for flight. All auxiliary components, i.e. engine, control surface linkages and hinges etc shall be installed correctly.
- 12.8.2 **Paint:** (as detailed) On those parts of the model that have been painted, care shall be taken to avoid brush marks, paint runs etc. A judging formula has been developed and shall be applied as follows:
1. A model which is fully painted shall be marked out of 20 points
 2. A model which is partially painted and covered with plastic film shall be marked out of 15 points
 3. A model which is fully covered in plastic film only shall be marked out of 10 points
- 12.8.3 **Construction:** (20 Points) The different parts of the model shall be glued to ensure all joints fit tightly together. Gaps between points are to be avoided. Similarly, excessive use of glue and smearing of glue is also to be avoided.
- 12.8.4 **Finish:** (20 Points) Attention shall be given to the covering materials used on the model and how they have been applied. The following shall be taken into account; creases in the covering, sealing of edges, excessive amount of dope used resulting in warping the structure, too much heat being used to apply plastic coverings, if used the proper application of decals or decorations.
- 12.8.5 **Adherence to Rules:** (10 points) Points will be deducted for each rule not adhered to e.g. entry form not completed with all relevant information, late entry, etc.

13.0 OPEN MODELLING.

- 13.1 The Open Modelling Competition will be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 13.2 This competition will be for all modellers over the age of 18.
- 13.3 Entrants may enter up to three models being one each for; plastic kit, built-up balsa and diorama.
- 13.5 This is a single winner competition in that no distinction will be made between boys and girls; the best entry is the winner.
- 13.6 Each model entered must comply with the provisions as detailed for the Plastic Kit, Built Up Non-Flying Balsa and Diorama Competitions respectively.
- 13.7 All care and no responsibility will be accepted to safeguard models from the public
- 13.8 Participants entering multiple models are unable to be awarded more than one 'place' however points will still be added to the Review Education Competition.

14.0 PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION.


- 14.1 The Photography Competition will be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.
- 14.2 The competition will be held in four sections:
 - 14.2.1 Group One: 8-11 Years
 - 14.2.2 Group Two: 12-15 Years
 - 14.2.3 Group Three: 16-17 Years
 - 14.2.4 Group Four: Open 18+ Years
- 14.3 Each group will have three categories:
 - 14.3.1 Colour Photograph - maximum 2 entries per person.
 - 14.3.2 Black and White Photograph - maximum 2 entries per person.
 - 14.3.3 Collage (more than one photograph grouped into one A4) - 1 entry per person.
- 14.4 ALL photography entries must be printed on A4 Matte photograph paper.
- 14.5 Photography themes for each section:
 - 14.5.1 Group One: 8-11 Years theme - **Recreation Activities.**
 - 14.5.2 Group Two: 12-15 Years theme - **Landmarks.**
 - 14.5.3 Group Three: 16-17 Years theme - **Animals.**
 - 14.5.4 Group Four: Open 18+ Years theme - **Nightsapes.** (NO plain black photographs accepted)
- 14.6 Photographs may be laminated, no extra points will be awarded for laminating.

15.0 COMPETITION ENTRIES.

- 15.1 Entry nominations are to be submitted via the Qld Group Events Database <https://queensland.airleague.com.au/eventsdb/> (log in credentials are the same at QM database) no later than 7th September 2019. A guide on how to nominate accompanies this circular as a separate attachment.
- 15.2 Essay entries are to be emailed to the Group Education Commissioner;

- 15.3 The Group Education Commissioner will accept scanned copies or photos of scrapbook entries so that posting via snail mail is not required.
- 15.4 Please read competition information sheets carefully before submitting entries.
- 15.5 It is highly recommended that Officers Commanding keep a list of entries.
